Districts of Miami Valley

Miami Valley Al-Anon Information Service (MVAIS, aka "Intergroup) participated in its largest public outreach event in April at the Levine Family Health Fair in Dayton. This annual event was attended by 3,000 – 4,000 people and featured a variety of "health wellness check" stations. Our display (two 8 -foot tables) was set up, along with plenty of literature, including Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism 2016 and local meeting schedules. Our volunteers talked with many people about "What is Al-Anon"?

We also provided public outreach literature and schedules to several smaller health fairs around the Miami Valley region. That can be attributed to getting our message out to the public. We had billboards in the Lima area at the first of the year and we keep our web site updated regularly.

Intergroup sponsored a workshop in May, featuring roundrobin discussion groups, followed up by a presentation of "Lois's Story". That was set up movie theater style, and popcorn was provided! Again, there was a lot of positive feedback from those who attended.

We sent letters to all of the radio and television stations earlier this year, urging them to run Al-Anon & Alateen PSA's. We received one report of a PSA during the "afternoon drive time" on a local radio station! More letters will be sent out in September.

There will be a "Recovery March" in Springfield in September, in observance of Recovery Month. Volunteers from Intergroup will be participating in that. Also in September, Sinclair College will host its staff & faculty health fair event, and Intergroup will have pamphlets and schedules available.
