Characteristics of the Family Disease: Alcoholism

“The Elephant In The Room”

Alcoholism has been declared an illness by the American Medical Association (since 1970), including identifiable symptoms and prognosis. What was once hidden, secret, and considered shameful by past generations has, (through organizations like AI-Anon), brought light and hope

to millions of families affected by this disease. One out of six people is intimately affected by another's drinking or using. Our culture is rampant with problems of alcohol and drug use. Our loved ones are affected but really the entire family suffers the effects of this disease. Even the youngest members can begin to model the behaviors & examples of the older members and the progressive generational cycle can, sadly, continue. In order not to pass on these effects, it is necessary to identify the problems that others who have come before us, have seen through their experience. Through the strength & hope of the recovery process in Al-Anon, we can help each other lift the veil of denial and bring healthy attitudes to improve the family situation. We can change our conditioned attitudes through awareness, acceptance, and finally action. Today, we have choices. Let's not pass this on to the next generation! Our families have suffered enough: "Let the family disease of alcoholism end with me".

Fall AWSC and Assembly will be announced later in the year.

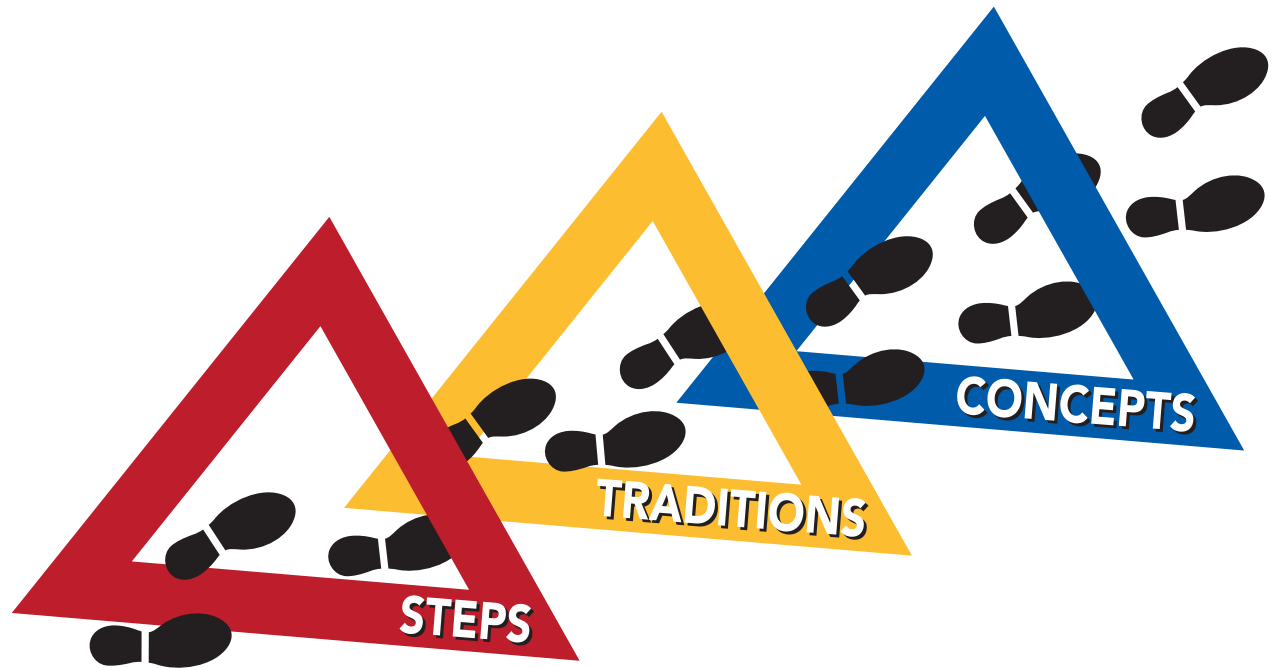
